ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

The Office of Healthy Aging (OHA) Adult Protective Services (APS) Unit is responsible for receiving and investigating reports of abuse, neglect, exploitation and self-neglect of Rhode Islanders 60 and older by a family member, caregiver, or person with duty of care.

RI law requires any person who has reasonable cause to believe that an older person has been abused, neglected, exploited or is self-neglecting, should make an immediate report it to OHA. Failure to report can result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

Adult Protective Service reports can be filed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and on nights, weekends, and holidays, by calling 401-462-0555 or on our website at oha.ri.gov.

The OHA APS Unit coordinates protective services with case management agencies who can provide assessment and care-planning, when needed or requested.

Under Rhode Island law (R.I.G.L 42-66-10), OHA records pertaining to a person reported to be abused, neglected, exploited, or self-neglecting, are confidential and are not deemed public records.

LONG TERM SERVICES AND SUPPORTS

Long-Term Services and Supports are a variety of services utilized by individuals of all ages with functional mental and physical limitations and chronic illness who need assistance with activities of daily living, including but not limited to preparing meals, managing medications and housekeeping. Long Term Services and Supports are delivered in both institutional and home and community-based settings.

Medicaid Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) are available for individuals over age 65 and for adults with disabilities. Services include **nursing home care or home and community-based supports (HCBS)**, such as homemaker/CNA services, special medical equipment, Meals on Wheels, personal emergency response systems, case management, , assisted living, or minor home modifications. Individuals must meet financial guidelines and be assessed to have a need for services. Only individuals who qualify for the highest level of care are eligible for nursing facility care.

For persons who may not meet the guidelines for Medicaid, The **OHA At Home Cost Share Program** may be able to provide Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) at a reduced rate. Co-share amounts are determined by income, these guidelines are updated annually & do not exceed 250% of the Federal Poverty Limit. OHA works with a network of regional case management agencies to develop care plans to help individuals remain in the least restrictive and safest environment.

To be eligible for the **At Home Cost Share Program**, a person must be a Rhode Island resident aged 65 or older, be ineligible for Medicaid, unable to leave home without considerable assistance, and need help with the tasks of daily living. To enroll in **PACE**, the client must agree to get their care from a network of doctors and providers who participate in the program. **PACE** coordinates all care to meet the daily needs of the client with a team of caregivers that includes social workers, nurses, and other professional staff. **PACE** is also a licensed **adult day service program**.

MEDICARE

Medicare is the nation's health insurance program for people 65 and older, and younger people who are disabled for 24 months, or who have end stage renal disease. Medicare consists of four parts—**Part A (Hospital Insurance)**, **Part B (Medical Insurance)**, **Part C (Medicare Advantage Insurance Plans)**, and **Medicare Part D (Medicare Prescription Drug Plans)**. Persons over age 65 are automatically entitled to Medicare Part A if they or their spouse are eligible for Social Security or Railroad Retirement.

Part A covers a portion of inpatient hospital, skilled nursing facility, home health, and hospice care. Part B is Medical coverage Part A coverage. Part B covers a portion of medical and physician services, outpatient hospital, home health, durable medical equipment, laboratory and x-ray, ambulance, and other services. Apply for Medicare at Social Security, or online three months before turning age 65.

MEDICARE PREMIUM PAYMENT PROGRAMS

Medicare Premium Payment (MPP) programs help Medicare beneficiaries pay some or all the cost of their Medicare Part A and Medicare Part B premiums, deductibles, and co-insurances.

For the **Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB)** program, the **Department of Human Services (DHS) Medicaid Division** will pay both the Medicare Part A, if applicable, and Medicare Part B premiums, deductibles, and co-insurance for persons over 65, and adults with disabilities, if their income does not exceed 100% of FPL.

For the **Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary program (SLMB)**, Medicaid will pay the Medicare Part B premium if the beneficiary's income does not exceed 120% of FPL.

For the **Qualified Individual (QI1)** program, Medicaid will pay the Medicare Part B premium, subject to availability of state funds, if the beneficiary's income does not exceed 135% of FPL.

MEDICATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Medicare Prescription Drug Plans (Medicare Part D) help Medicare beneficiaries pay for prescription drugs. Coverage is available for both generic and brand name medications. Premiums, deductibles, and co-payments may apply.

Assistance in paying for Medicare Part D plan premiums and other expenses (**Low-Income Subsidy-LIS, or “Extra Help”**) may be available for beneficiaries who have limited income and resources. The **Rhode Island Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Elderly (RIPAE)** program pays some of the cost of RIPAE-approved prescription medications during the deductible phase and offers partial reimbursement for RIPAE-approved medications to enrollees who enter the “donut hole” of their Medicare Part D plans, or if a medication is not covered by a Part D plan and is on the RIPAE formulary. Rhode Island residents 65 and older who meet certain income limits and provide proof of Medicare Part D coverage, and adults aged 55 to 64 receiving Social Security Disability (SSDI) payments, may be eligible.

Income guidelines are adjusted in each July, based on the annual Social Security Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA).

PENSION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

For many older adults, **pensions** are a significant part of their retirement income. **Pensions, Social Security benefits, savings, and investments all contribute to financial security in the post-employment world.** With the shifting of pensions from defined benefits to 401 (k), 403 (b), and other plans, company mergers, business bankruptcies, and the introduction of hybrid pension plans, it can be difficult to determine if you are entitled to a benefit, what that benefit is, and how to apply for benefits.

The **New England Pension Assistance Project (NEPAP)**, affiliated with the **Gerontology Institute at the University of Massachusetts in Boston**, offers free pension counseling services to Rhode Islanders to help them find lost pensions, correct pension errors, and answer questions about pension laws. The service can include tracing pension benefits from companies that have been merged or have gone bankrupt, researching, and filing for spousal or survival benefits, and answering pension eligibility questions.

SOCIAL SECURITY

Bridge Fund (GPA-Bridge)

Couples or individuals pending a decision on an SSI application may be eligible for GPA-Bridge. GPA-Bridge provides a small, \$200 cash payment, to individuals unable to work due to disability, who are not eligible for SSDI and have very low incomes. The GPA program also funds funeral and burial services for GPA recipients and qualified individuals. The cost of burial services is limited to \$900 and is reduced based on the income and resources of the deceased and any legally liable relatives.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) provides cash payments to qualified persons 65 and older, blind, or adults with disabilities. TRANSPORTATION

The **Rhode Island Public Transit Authority (RIPTA)**, 705 Elmwood Avenue, Providence, offers people who are low-income and either have a disability or are age 65+ the opportunity to apply for a RIPTA No Fare Photo ID smart card. These cards enable passengers to ride free of charge on fixed-route buses and Flex shuttles for two years.
